



Dear Families of Evergreen Students,

We wanted to share with you some updated information regarding the tragedy that happened on Evergreen's campus in December. Below please find a community update that was sent out to students, staff, and faculty earlier today. Additional information is also available at www.evergreen.edu/campustragedy.

Greetings Evergreen Community,

It has been just over three months since the tragic death of Jonathan Rodriguez. Our campus is still grieving.

Today, the Washington State Patrol issued a statement signifying the conclusion of their investigation into what happened on December 11, 2023. The State Patrol has outlined four main findings:

- The tankless hot water heater recently installed by a contractor in the mod housing unit was not installed properly;
- Detectors were sounding and should have been treated as a carbon monoxide event, rather than a faulty alarm system;
- Lack of training and understanding of the fire alarm system; and
- Evergreen protocols were insufficient.

We do not have the full investigation report yet. When we have the report in hand, we will spend the necessary time going through it line by line to better understand what happened.

The college will issue a press release shortly and we are expecting media attention. Marketing and Communications staff are responsible for handling all media inquiries. If you get contacted, please direct them to www.evergreen.edu/news-events/media-inquiries
