One Last Road Trip

The Geoducks hit the road for the final time this season as the green and white head south to take on Oregon Tech and Southern Oregon in a pair of Cascade Conference counters.

By The Numbers

As a team, the Geoducks are second in the conference in three-point field goals per game, sinking an average of 8.38 per game. Individually, senior **Patrick Lewis** is third in the conference in rebounding at 7.6 rpg, including at CCC-best 3.50 orpg, while junior **Travis Wagner** is second in three-pointers per game at 2.54.

If The Playoffs Started Today

The Geoducks are officially out of the playoff hunt but that doesn't mean that they can't play spoiler over the final three games. If the conference tournament were to start this week, the first round matchups would be:

- #8 College of Idaho (9-17, 4-11 CCC) at #1 Northwest (23-2, 13-2 CCC)
- #7 Concordia (14-11, 6-8 CCC) at #2 Oregon Tech (23-3, 12-2 CCC)
- #6 Corban (15-11, 7-7 CCC) at #3 Warner Pacific (19-6, 11-3 CCC)
- #5 Eastern Oregon (15-9, 8-7 CCC) at #4 Southern Oregon (15-10, 8-6 CCC)

Scouting Oregon Tech

Ranked second in the nation, the Hustlin' Owls fly into the weekend with a record of 23-3 overall and 12-2 in CCC play, good enough for second place in the conference standings. As a team, OIT is averaging 83.5 ppg under legendary coach Danny Miles, while allowing 67.0 ppg on defense for a +16.5 scoring margin. The Owls also hold a +5.0 rebounding margin and a +4.8 turnover margin. Individually, Bobby Hunter leads the team with 19.7 ppg, 5.1 rpg and 2.3 spg. David Clarke is making sure the ball ends up in the scorers' hands, dishing out 4.3 apg.

Scouting Southern Oregon

The Raiders currently sit at 15-10 on the year, including 8-6 in the Cascade Conference. As a team, SOU is averaging 73.5 ppg on offense and 71.7 ppg on defense for a +1.8 scoring margin. Southern also holds a +2.8 rebounding margin but have been a little less disciplined in guard play, averaging 1.8 more turnovers per game than their opponents. Eric Thompson leads SOU in scoring at 19.7 ppg, also leading the team in rebounding with 7.6 rpg. Jeff Bush is averaging 3.4 assists per game while Kyle Tedder is responsible for 1.3 steals per game.
