Final Set

A rebuilding 2011 campaign comes to a close this weekend as the Geoducks head down to Oregon, hoping to pick off a win at Corban and Northwest Christian.

Statistically Speaking

Despite struggling to find a way into the win column, the Geoducks are still represented in some of the statistical standings around the conference. Senior **Jasmine Horton** is ninth in the CCC in kills, averaging 2.78 per set. Sophomore setter **Erin Mitchell** is fourth in the CCC in service aces with 0.40 per frame and 11th in the conference in assists per set at 5.17.

Scouting Corban

The Warriors come into the weekend with a record of 11-13 overall and 5-11 in CCC play, having picked up a 3-1 win over Northwest Christian on Friday night. On offense, Corban is led by 2.57 kills per set from Chandra Baskoro. Megan Dees is averaging 5.44 assists per set while Bethany Durre is digging out an average of 4.29 balls per frame.

Scouting Northwest Christian

Currently holding a record of 11-14 overall and 6-11 in CCC play, the Beacons are currently riding a three-match losing streak as they welcome Northwest and Evergreen to Eugene this weekend. Maren Mansfield leads NCU with 2.41 kills per set. Cori Wallace leads the team with 8.28 assists per set while Dana Clark averages 4.73 digs per set.

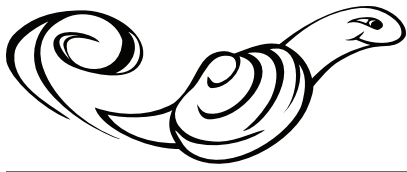

Geoducks Swept In Season Opener

LA GRANDE, Ore. – With just six healthy bodies suiting up, the Evergreen Geoducks struggled in their season opener but got better with each set as they were swept by the Eastern Oregon Mountaineers in a Cascade Conference volleyball match on Friday night in La Grande, Ore.

In the first set, the Mounties (1-6, 1-0 CCC) quickly built a lead, holding a 10-2 advantage before the Geoducks (0-1, 0-1 CCC) managed their first kill of the night. EOU cruised through the first set, picking up a 25-5 set one win after committing just one attack error on 14 attempts.

In the second set, Evergreen managed to improve their hitting percentage but so did Eastern Oregon as they put down 15 kills en route to a 25-4 set two win as they took the early advantage.

In the third set, Evergreen found themselves down early but climbed back within four points at 12-8 but EOU then used a 13-2 run, including eight straight points to end the match, to collect the 25-10 set win and sweep the match in three.

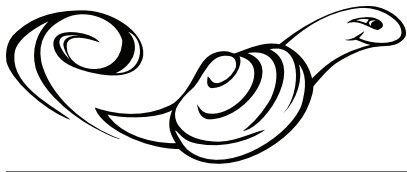
The Geoducks were led by four kills each from Jasmine Horton (Seattle, Wash./Foster HS) and Stephanie Peshlakai-John (Kirtland, N.M./Western Texas College). Taylor Good (Dupont, Wash./Steilacoom HS) led the team with eight digs while Horton picked up the Geoducks' only block of the night.

Things won't get any easier for Evergreen on Saturday night as they venture into the Mountain Time Zone for a match against 10th-ranked College of Idaho, beginning at 7pm MDT in Caldwell, Idaho.

Eastern Oregon Univ. def. Evergreen 25-5,25-4,25-10

OLYMPIA, Wash. – After honoring seniors Jasmine Horton (Seattle, Wash./Foster HS) and Chantal Petkus (Richland, Wash./Hanford HS) before the match, the Evergreen Geoducks battled tough but it was the Oregon Tech Owls who earned the sweep, 3-0, in a Cascade Conference volleyball match on Saturday afternoon in CRC Gymnasium in Olympia, Wash.

The Owls (13-10, 7-9 CCC) took the lead early but the Geoducks (0-17, 0-16 CCC) remained pesky, staying within a few points for most of the set. Evergreen managed to tie things up at 18-18 late in the match but Oregon Tech stepped up to collect the 25-21 set one win.

Set two was also tight as Evergreen seeming played point-for-point with the Owls. Oregon Tech finally used a 6-2 run at the end to take the 25-19 victory and the 2-0 match lead. The Geoducks actually out-hit the Owls in the frame, putting down 10 kills with three errors on 28 total swings for a .250 clip, compared with 12 kills and six errors on 30 attacks for Oregon Tech.

The third set was all Oregon Tech from the beginning as the Geoducks struggled to keep it close. The Owls threw down 14 kills with just one error on 27 attacks for a .481 hitting percentage as they earned the 25-16 win to clinch the match, 3-0.

Evergreen was led by a match-high 14 kills from Horton, who also added nine digs and two blocks on the afternoon. Erin Mitchell (Santa Cruz, Calif./Mt. Madonna School) put up 23 assists as well as a team-high 11 digs on the match. The Geoducks had their best hitting match of the season, putting down 27 kills with 17 errors on 87 attacks for a season-best .115 hitting percentage.

The balanced Oregon Tech attack was led by nine kills from Mindy Nalder. Sarah Svedin finish with 19 assists while libero Krystie Vea dug out a match-high 13 balls on the match. Oregon Tech hit .307 on the afternoon, putting down 38 kills with 11 errors on 88 total swings.

The Geoducks will next be in action on Friday evening when they travel to Corban. Oregon Tech will also play on Friday, playing host to Eastern Oregon. Both matches are set to begin at 7:00 pm.
