## Riding The Momentum

After picking up two big wins over the weekend, including a 1-0 upset over #3 Concordia, the Evergreen Geoducks will use the momentum built to try and finish 2011 on a high note as the regular season comes to a close on Monday.

## By The Numbers

As a team, the Geoducks are tied for fifth in saves with 68. Individually, freshman keeper **Lauren Davidson** is fifth in both saves, with 60, and in savers per game, at 5.00 per match.

## Honoring Our Seniors

Before Monday's season-finale against Oregon Tech, the Geoducks will honor their seniors, who will be playing their final game for the green and white.

## Scouting Southern Oregon

Currently sitting in second place, three points back of Concordia, Southern Oregon comes to Washington with a record of 10-5-1 overall and 6-1-0 in CCC play. In their last six matches, the Raiders have outscored their opponents 15-2. Individually, Stephanie Carr is the player to watch on offense, having scored nine goals in 16 matches played. Jessica Kuehlwein has seen the majority of time in net for SOU, allowing 12 goals in 1371:03 for a 0.79 GAA and a .786 save percentage.

## Scouting Oregon Tech

The Owls head into the weekend holding a record of 5-7-1 overall and 3-4-0 in CCC play, including just 1-4 in their last five matches. Individually, Meghan Drost has been the catalyst on offense, scoring eight times and assisting on six others in 12 matches played. Rebekah Matteri has been in net for all 1220:00 minutes, allowing 31 goals for a 2.29 GAA and a .752 save percentage.

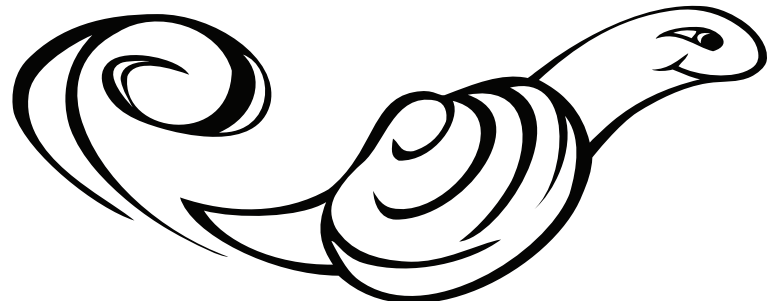

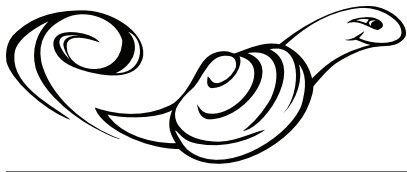

OLYMPIA, Wash. – A pair of goals by senior Anastasia Daniels (Olympia, Wash./South Puget Sound CC) led the way as the Evergreen Geoducks doubled up the visiting George Fox Bruins, 4-2, in a non-conference women's soccer game on Friday afternoon on a sunny Evergreen Pitch in Olympia, Wash.

The Geoducks (2-2-0) opened up the scoring in the 13th minute after Rayna Murphy (Longview, Wash./Mark Morris HS) fed a beautiful cross to the boot of Teresa Lopez (Yakima, Wash./Yakima Valley CC), who put it just inside the right post for a 1-0 Evergreen lead over the Bruins (0-2-2).

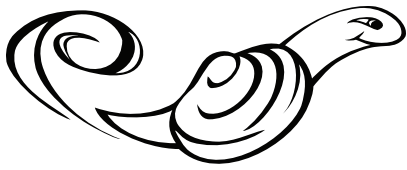

## **Geoducks Earn First CCC Win Since 2008**

OLYMPIA, Wash. – A pair of goals by junior Deirdre Dornay (Mercer Island, Wash./Bellevue College) in the first half was enough to propel the Evergreen Geoducks to a 2-1 win over the visiting Warner Pacific Knights in a Cascade Conference women's soccer match on Saturday afternoon on Evergreen Pitch in Olympia, Wash. The win was the first for Evergreen in Cascade Conference play since Oct. 25, 2008.

The Geoducks (3-8-1, 1-5-0 CCC) first got on the clock in the 23rd minute when Lea Rohan (Las Vegas, Nev./Jackson State Univ.) sent in a corner kick and Dornay gathered the ball from a scrum in the middle of the net, firing it in from close range for the 1-0 lead over the Knights (4-4-1, 3-4-0 CCC). Dornay made it 2-0 just a few minutes later following a shot by Teresa Lopez (Yakima, Wash./Walla Walla CC) that careened off the crossbar to the feet of Dornay, who fired it through the crowd from about 10 yards out.

The Knights got on the board in the second half when Anna Blakeslee beat Evergreen keeper Lauren Davidson (Seattle, Wash./North Seattle CC) on a breakaway in the 64th minute, pulling WPC back within one. The Geoduck defense tightened up and the offense kept applying pressure the remainder of the game, allowing Evergreen to earn their first conference win since a 2-0 win at home over Northwest Christian on Oct. 25, 2008.

Davidson was solid in net, making five saves for the green and white. Warner Pacific's Nikita Rivera was also strong in net, making seven saves for the Knights as the Geoducks held a 24-9 advantage on shots.

Evergreen will be back in action on Monday afternoon when they play host to third-ranked Concordia (Ore.). Warner Pacific will be in action on Monday as well, traveling to Kirkland, Wash. to take on Northwest.

### **Geoducks Stun #3 Cavs, 1-0**

OLYMPIA, Wash. – Coming into Monday afternoon, the third-ranked Concordia Cavaliers had not lost a Cascade Conference match in over two years but come Monday evening, that was no longer the case as the Evergreen Geoducks stunned the Cavs, 1-0, in a CCC women's soccer match on Monday afternoon on Geoduck Pitch in Olympia, Wash.

The Geoducks (4-8-1, 2-5-0 CCC) took the lead in the 17th minute when Brianna Speed (Seattle, Wash./Lake Washington HS) fed in a cross from the touchline to the left post and the waiting head of Deirdre Dornay (Mercer Island, Wash./Bellevue College), who put it in the net for her third goal in two games.

Concordia (12-4-1, 7-1-0 CCC) looked to have tied it up in the 31st minute but the Cavs' goal was disallowed because of off-sides. The Cavaliers held control for most of the second half, outshooting the Geoducks, 14-1, in the final 45 minutes but fate was shining on Evergreen as they earned the 1-0 upset win.

Freshman keeper Lauren Davidson (Seattle, Wash./North Seattle CC) was splendid in net for the Geoducks, making six saves to collect the clean sheet. Tori Talbutt made two saves for the Cavaliers as all three Evergreen shots were on net.

The win is the first for Evergreen over Concordia since a 1-0 victory in Portland on Sep. 28, 2005, breaking a losing streak of nine to the Cavs. In addition, it marks the first CCC loss for Concordia since a 2-1 overtime loss against College of Idaho on Oct. 23, 2009.

The Geoducks will look to extend their win streak to three matches on Saturday afternoon when they play host to Southern Oregon in a match set to begin at 1:00 pm. Concordia will also next be in action on Saturday, playing host to Rose City rival Warner Pacific in a match set to start at 7:00 pm.
