

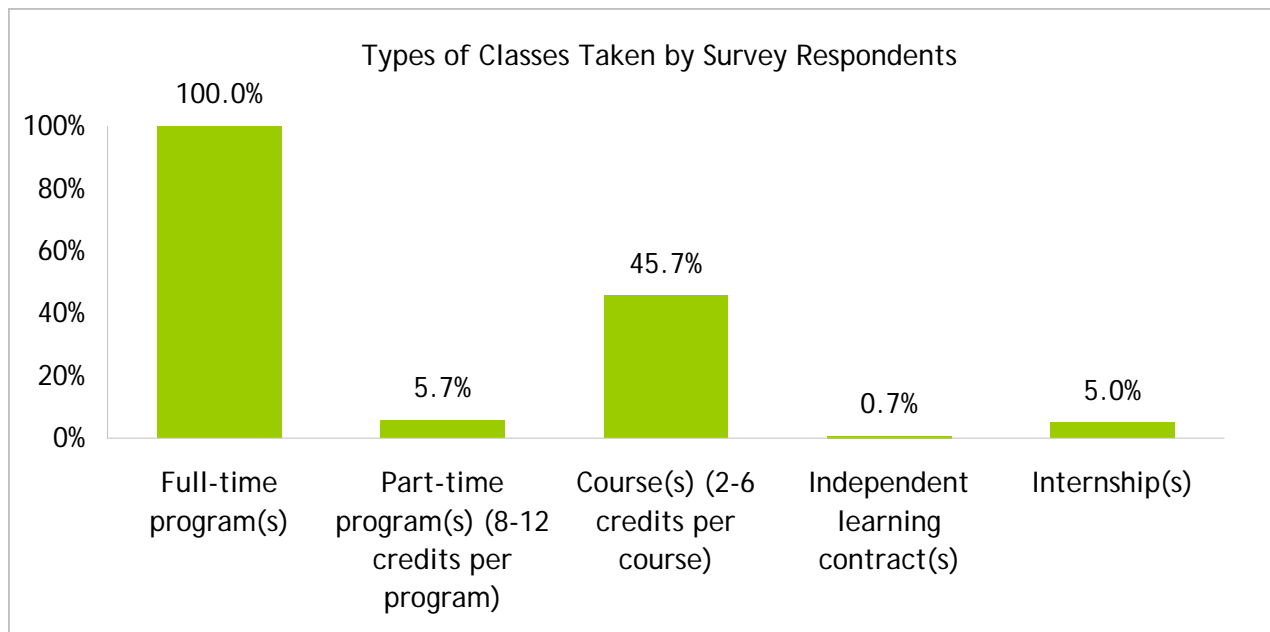

Responses of First-Time, First-Year Students

Types of Classes Taken by First-Time, First-Year Respondents (Academic Year 07-08)

Using quarterly enrollment data, the kinds of classes survey respondents took during Academic Year 07-08 were analyzed. All of first-time, first-year respondents had taken at least one full-time program. Almost 46% had taken a course (2-6 credits per course). A total of 5.7% of first-time, first-year respondents had taken a part-time program (8-12 credits per program), 5.0% had taken an internship, and 0.7% had taken an independent learning contract.

Independent learning contract(s)	0.7%

*Percentages do not add up to 100% because students could indicate as many different types of programs/courses as they had taken in a single year.



Combinations of Classes Taken During the Year (In Mutually Exclusive Categories)

In order to understand the combinations of class types that first-time, first-year respondents had taken in one year, respondents were grouped into categories based on the kinds of classes they took in the 2007-008 school year. The largest percentage of respondents took daytime programs only (52.1%) with the next largest group taking full-time programs and courses (36.4%). Five percent of respondents took full-time programs, part-time programs, and courses. In the table below, Independent study refers to contracts and internships.

Full-Time Programs and Part-Time Programs	0.7%
