Responses of First-Time, First-Year Students

**Ability to Enroll in First Choice of Academic Offerings**

Students were asked to indicate whether they were able to enroll in their first choice of academic offerings. The percentage of first-time, first-year respondents indicating that they could not enroll in their first choice of academic offerings ranged from a low of 13.0% in winter 2008 to a high of 15.2% in spring 2008. Students were then asked to indicate what academic offerings they would have preferred if they were not able to enroll in their first choice. Responses are listed by quarter below.
