

Clery Report: Stalking

Evergreen is committed to providing on-campus security, education, training and victim services to combat violence against all persons. "Stalking" is defined as repeatedly engaging in a course of conduct, such as following, harassing, threatening, or intimidating another by telephone, mail, electronic communication, social media, or any other device, method or action directed at another individual that would cause a reasonable person to experience alarm, fright or determine that their safety, or the safety of those affiliated or associated with them is at risk

The Student Health and Counseling Center offers support and counseling for individuals that have experienced stalking.

The Student Health Center and Office of Sexual Assault Prevention do not limit services to those who are victims of sexual assault or domestic violence. Rather, they are committed to enhancing the development of students by supporting, educating and collaborating with them as they learn to make healthy choices.

A student victim of stalking has the right, in addition to filing charges through the criminal justice system, to file a complaint with the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs and Dean of Student and Academic Services, relative to acts of violence toward them or another committed by Evergreen student(s). It does not matter whether the act of violence occurred on-campus or off-campus since the college reserves the right to hold students

accountable for certain types of off-campus behavior. Disciplinary action may result if a student's behavior is found to be in violation of the Student Conduct Code and/or Social Contract.

Examples of such off-campus behavior would include but not be limited to crimes of violence, sexual assault and/or alcohol or drug violations. Stalking is prohibited by the Student Conduct Code and the Social Contract.
