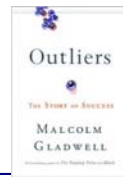

New Edible Landscaping in Residential and Dining Services

If you get a chance this summer you may want to take a walk down to the Residential area and enjoy the new gardens. A number of students and student staff collaborated to develop underutilized grounds into food-producing polycultures. Next to the HCC, Natalie Pyrooz worked with a shady forested area to cultivate a combination of native and cultivar edible species, including strawberries, raspberries, salmonberries, and kiwis, as well as examples of unique plants such as gunnera, sochi tea, and wintergreen. This project includes plant identification signs. In addition, a new vegetable garden was installed in the MODs next to the new shop which houses our student worker program. Student Sam Lanz installed a garden of both perennial and annual food crops that include tomatoes, eggplants, and culinary herbs. New fruit trees were also installed in the spring by students in the MODs. These areas will help students develop a connection to the land, give them the opportunity to observe how things grow, and bring a diverse array of green space to our campus grounds.
