Commencement & Super Saturday

Kudos to our colleagues in Enrollment Services for their work coordinating [Commencement](#) on June 13th and congratulations to the 1,292 students who were eligible to walk in the ceremony. Of the undergraduates, 20% were students of color, five were international students, and two were staff members with ages ranging from 19 to 68 years. The 27th class of the [MPA](#) program included 61 students; the 16th [MIT](#) class included 34 students; and the 22nd [MES](#) class had 15 students. Red Square was full and the program included [comments](#) from students Richard Oldenburg and Trisha Towanda; faculty member Russ Fox; and guest [James Loewen](#). June 14th marked the 30th anniversary of Super Saturday which featured over 100 arts and crafts, food, and native arts vendors, live entertainment on four stages, community groups, Kid’s Country, and the Greener Oasis wine and beer garden. This event is planned and implemented by staff from across the College with leadership from Student Affairs.
