


Was there any information about Evergreen that was hard to find?

Students were asked in an open-ended question if there was any information about Evergreen that was hard to find. Responses from First-time, First-year students were categorized and are summarized below. More than half of First-time, First-year respondents (61%) indicated that there was no information about Evergreen that was hard to find. The remaining 39% had difficulty finding information. *The categories below are not mutually exclusive, so they will not add up to 100%.*

Among students who had difficulty finding information:

18% of students had difficulty finding Program information and registration; the hardest information to find for this group of students was class schedules and how to register. 9% had difficulty navigating the website. 24% had difficulty finding information about Residential and Dining Services (RAD), many questioned if freshman were required to live in dorms. 21% had difficulty finding Financial Aid and Cost Information. 12% were trying to find information about the student experience at Evergreen, including information on student activities, athletics, and disability information. 6% said it was hard to find information about Evergreen's unique structure. 7% of respondents with difficulty finding information had a hard time finding information about curriculum content and alternative learning opportunities. 4% had questions about transferring credit and other admissions questions, 15% 'Other' (including graduation & retention rates, diversity statistics, pictures, videos, student email, and questions regarding the faculty and staff).
