SECTION 1: INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMITTING APPLICATION MATERIALS BY EMAIL

- 1. Fill out the application. Do not forget to save along the way.
 - a) Collect all your attachments:
 - b) Artist Résumé
 - c) Documentation of Tribal Affiliation.
 - d) Project Budget. (Sample budget provided)
 - e) Art Samples (Up to six work samples may be provided, label and title each).

 Note: Master/ Apprentice collaborations are to provide additional information.
- 2. Format all Attachments. All your materials should be saved as separate documents and title each with the type of document and your name. Example: Art Sample: First Name, Last Name.
- 3. Email all Application materials: Documents may be too large and require you to email your application in multiple batches. If so, in the Subject line of your email title each: <u>First name, Last Name, Applicant</u> and send to: Mary.Kummer@evergreen.edu.

All applicants will receive an email acknowledgement that your application was successfully submitted. Due to the number of applications received it may take a few days to send a response. Questions regarding any part of the submission process may be directed to Mary Kummer at 360 692 9487.

SECTION 2: GRANT GUIDELINES

The Native Creative Development Program[™] is a unique program originating with the House of Welcome. We encourage creative development for Native artists who are working to strengthen Native art forms, practice and knowledge of traditional and contemporary art.

Art mediums may be in any visual artistic form. Performance-based includes music and film. Funding supports traditional, contemporary, and experimental art forms.

This program has expanded to include collaborative master/ apprentice partnership opportunities to support teaching and learning together. All grants are for Native artists residing in **Washington**, **Oregon**, **Idaho**, **and Montana**.

Native is defined as: American Indian, Alaska Native or Native Hawaiian. Documentation of tribal affiliation is required.

Individual Artist Program Criteria

Each applicant will provide a clear description of objectives, activities, and any community engagement plans. Include how your creative practice is connected to your Native cultural identity, values, and community and:

- Advances your artist's development, art form and creative practice.
- Contribute to the field of Native art as an integral member of the artistic and cultural community.
- You may offer teaching and learning opportunities via workshops, classes, and mentorship with practicing
 artists. If you are preparing for an event, gathering, you may build on your art where it will be utilized or
 displayed.
- Sustainability- show through your project narrative and budget how you are on a sustainable path of demonstrating how the real costs of creating work take place.

Fund Amount

Awards of up to \$5,000 for individuals

Awards for Master/ Apprentice collaborations are up to \$6,000.

Application Closes: Friday, October 28, 2022 **Award Notification:** December 15, 2022

Project duration: 9 months to 1-year to complete the project

Final Report Requirement: At the conclusion of the project, each artist will be expected to complete a simple evaluation of their project and how the project met goals outlined in the application. A separate email will be sent with a link and the short evaluation form.

Note: All final projects must be closed out prior to re-applying for new grants.

Required Application Attachments

You will be asked to upload the following documents as a part of the application:

- Artist Résumé
- Documentation of Tribal Affiliation
- Budget (sample budget provided)
- Art Samples (Up to six work samples may be provided, kindly label and title each provided). If you send your application via e-mail, jpeg images may be very large and require you to send multiple e-mails.

Supplemental Letters of Collaboration

Attach a letter of support if your project involves working in participation of community members or Tribal communities. Include a letter from individuals or groups. Projects that identify a Tribal community or working with other individuals will not be reviewed without letters of support.

This opportunity is open to any American Indian, Alaska Native or Native Hawaiian artist who resides in the 4-state region of Washington, Oregon, Idaho, and Montana. You must identify your Tribal affiliation and provide documentation from the Tribe of your status as a citizen, or descendant. Native Hawaiian artists may submit a copy of birth certificate identifying Hawaiian ancestry.

SECTION 3: NARRATIVE QUESTIONS

1. Provide your project description with timeline, goals, objectives.

Describe your project and what it is you want to do? Include your goals of your creative practice. Describe the timeline for your creative work. Share in-depth your practice and process for artmaking.

Note: You may submit all your narrative questions as a separate document (MS word or PDF format).

2.	How will the proposed project advance your artistic development, art form, and creative practice
2	How does your art practice contribute to the field of Native art.
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Additional narrative question for Master/Apprentice collaborations. If applying for a master/apprentice grant, describe who is involved and how you are spending time together during artmaking sessions with increased time on skill development and actively learning from one another through mentorships. Master | Apprentice collaborations must be able to meet regularly in-person for face-to-face artistic development. Be sure to include letters of support from individuals and/or community you identify.

- Film: any type of film file or link to YouTube, Vimeo, etc.
 Please make sure attached film file(s) do not exceed 2GB
- Music: any type of sound file, or web link to sample.
 Please make sure attached music file(s) do not exceed 2GB
