

CHECKLIST FOR DACA RECIPIENTS WHO WISH TO STUDY ABROAD

Basic Advance Parole eligibility. If your answer to any of these questions is “NO” then you are not able to apply for AP at this time.

1. Have you received an approval of your DACA applications? Yes No
2. Do you wish to travel overseas for education, employment, or humanitarian purposes?

Once you’ve decided *you meet basic eligibility requirements and have met with an attorney, complete the following checklist.* (Make sure you’ve already met with the Office of International Programs & Services before continuing)

- Investigate visa requirement for your intended host country; determine if you will need to travel to your country of origin
- Apply for your chosen study abroad program
- Ask program administrators if there is any nuanced information that may impact your experience
- (Once accepted by study abroad program) APPLY FOR ADVANCE PAROLE
- Connect with the Office of International Programs & Services and/or your specific study abroad program to prepare for your time abroad
- Receive AP approval (Form I-512L) and make copies of important documents
- Depart with items needed to re-enter the US after program completion
