

Summary: Overall, 59% of new degree-seeking students at the Olympia campus attended at least one A.S. O-week session, down from 62% in Fall 2018. First-time, First-year attendance at Academic Statement Orientation stayed the same from Fall 2018 to Fall 2019 at 76%. Transfer participation dropped 2 percentage points, 55% in 2018 compared to 53% in 2019. While most students opt for the daytime sessions, 17% attended weekend or evening sessions.

WA State Transfer students were less likely to attend O-week sessions compared to Non-resident Transfers and all First-time, First-years. Non-resident First-time, First-years had the highest attendance rate. There were 5 Returning Greeners who attended Academic Statement Sessions.

Hispanic and non-Hispanic Asian students had higher attendance rates. Veterans, Black students, students with a disability, and men had lower attendance rates. On average, students who opted not to attend had lower high school and college GPAs. Students with conditional admission status had lower attendance rates.
