


**End-of-Program Review 2019-20**  
**Social Sciences in all programs**

The presence (Extensively, Moderately or A little) of Social Sciences in programs offered in 2019-20 decreased from 71% in the previous year to 68%. The most common fields of Social Sciences taught in programs that included this division were: Public Policy (41%), Communication (27%), Anthropology (22%), and Sociology (22%).



