

## November 19, 2025 Faculty Meeting Minutes – FINAL

Faculty Chair Nathalie Yuen opened the meeting at 3:10 p.m. with a review of the agenda.

Alternative Models of Crisis Response Disappearing Task Force discussion – Task force members Prita Lal, Sina Hill, Casey Lalonde, Sam Snelson, Michael Joseph, and Arita Balaram introduced themselves and shared information on their near-final report, guided by the following recommendations: Phase 1: Establishing a Campus Incident Response Evaluation Committee; Phase 2: Crisis Hotline; and Phase 3: Establishment of a Campus Community Response Team for Healing-Centered Crisis Response. A discussion ensued.

Credit Equivalencies and Curriculum Mapping – Amy Betz introduced Course Dog as a new catalog system and tool in support of tracking credit equivalencies. Abir Biswas then led a workshop on documenting anticipated credit equivalencies. Steff Beck provided guidance on a reflection session about the activity.

- Richard Weiss introduced workshops that are being offered by the Washington Center.
- Amy Betz introduced Yann Jugeat, Evergreen's new faculty personnel program manager.

Faculty Handbook addition – At the week 6 faculty meeting, Evergreen's AAC&U Institute on AI, Pedagogy, and Curriculum members introduced a change to the faculty handbook that reads, "Faculty will include guidelines for the appropriate use or abstention from use of technologies such as generative artificial intelligence in the syllabus for every course or program." Greg Mullins provided further information on questions raised at or since this meeting. Nathalie introduced Robert's Rules of Order (in modified form) and opened the floor for debate on the motion. The question was called and seconded and voting was opened. [The votes, counted after the meeting, were 37 yes, 3 no, and 1 abstention.]

Supporting Undocumented and Immigrant Students: Community-Based Resources for Faculty – Undocumented Student Task Force members Alice Nelson and Catalina Ocampo Londoño provided information on publicly available community-based resources about supporting undocumented students and community members, along with the campus policy. They announced an upcoming immigration and community support workshop in February. A brief Q&A followed the presentation.
