

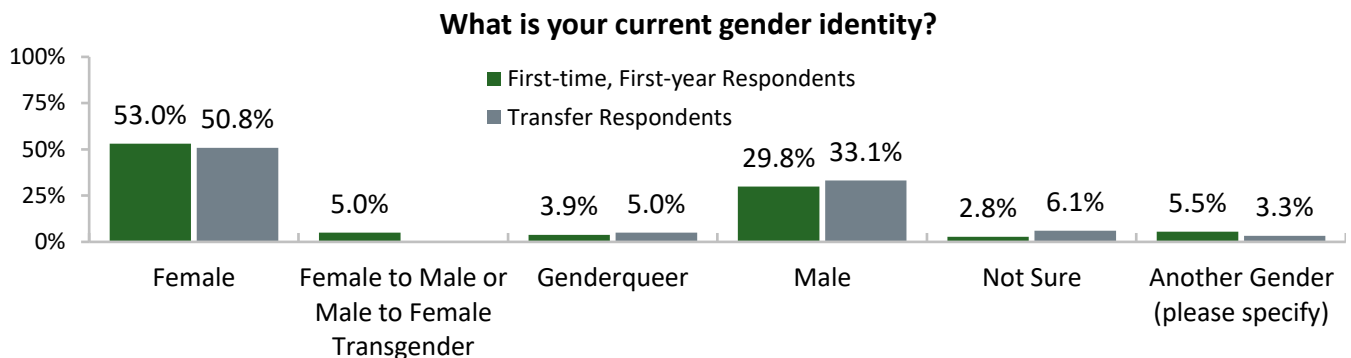
What sex were you assigned at birth on your original birth certificate?

Respondents are asked what sex they were assigned at birth on their original birth certificate. 68% of First-time, First-years were assigned female at birth, while 32% were assigned male. 60% of Transfers were assigned female at birth, while 40% were assigned male.

What is your current gender identity?

Students were asked about their current gender identity. 53% of First-time, First-year (FTFY) respondents are female, 30% male, 5% transgender, 4% genderqueer, 3% not sure, and 6% another gender (listed below). 18% of FTFY students have a gender identity that is not the same as the sex assigned on their birth certificate or are not sure with what gender they identify. Transfer respondents are 51% female, 33% male, 5% genderqueer, 3% another gender (listed below), and 6% aren't sure with what gender they identify. 17% of Transfer students have a gender identity that is not the same as the sex assigned on their birth certificate or are not sure with what gender they identify
