**Summary:** Overall, 80% of new degree-seeking students at Olympia and Grays Harbor campuses attended at least one A.S. O-week session, down from 88% in Fall 2015. First-time, First-year attendance at Academic Statement Orientation sessions remained fairly consistent in Fall 2016 relative to Fall 2015. However, Transfer participation decreased to 74% in 2016, from 87% in 2015. While most students opt for the daytime sessions, 10% attended Saturday sessions (which are down a bit from 11% the prior year.) Evening session attendance rose from 2% in 2015 to 5% in 2016

In terms of admission type, Returning Greeners and WA State Transfer students were least likely to attend O-week sessions. Non-resident First-time, first-years had the highest attendance rate.

Females and males attended at the same rate. Veterans, students with disabilities, mulit-racial students, and unreported race were less likely to attend.

On average, students who opted not to attend had lower prior high school and college GPAs. Students with conditional admission status were less likely to attend.
