

**Student Rights & Responsibilities**  
**2018/19 Academic Year Report**  
**September 15, 2018 through June 14, 2019**

The information provided below reflects reports of alleged violations of the Code of Student Rights and Responsibilities (Code) for September 15, 2018 through June 14, 2019 (end of spring quarter).

The data for this time period reflects receipt of **716 individual reports** of alleged violation of the Code involving 964 individual student reports. Of this 964, 495 initial reports were promptly closed with no violation. The 495 student cases closed with no violation are reports in Residential & Dining Services (RAD) which are initially tracked through the conduct database and promptly referred to other processes. Table 2 represents the status of the **469 student cases** addressed with the Code.

Over 95% of the individual students and associated alleged violations occurred in the residence halls where 74% of our new first-time first-year students reside. This 95% represents 26% of the students who reside in housing. The conduct landscape includes a high number of low-level cases which occur primarily within on-campus residential facilities and a low number of elevated cases which occur within our conduct jurisdiction non-residentially. Generally, cases involving residential students are adjudicated by professional staff within housing. Student paraprofessional staff members in Residential & Dining Services (RAD) worked diligently this year to uphold community standards and policies to support a positive living and learning environment. Their attentiveness has generated most of the reports.

Cases involving non-residential students are adjudicated by the Director of Student Rights and Responsibilities as well as some elevated conduct cases which involve residential students accused of repeated and/or escalating behaviors. These cases may have extended adjudication times due to investigation complexities and, in some cases utilize interim actions.

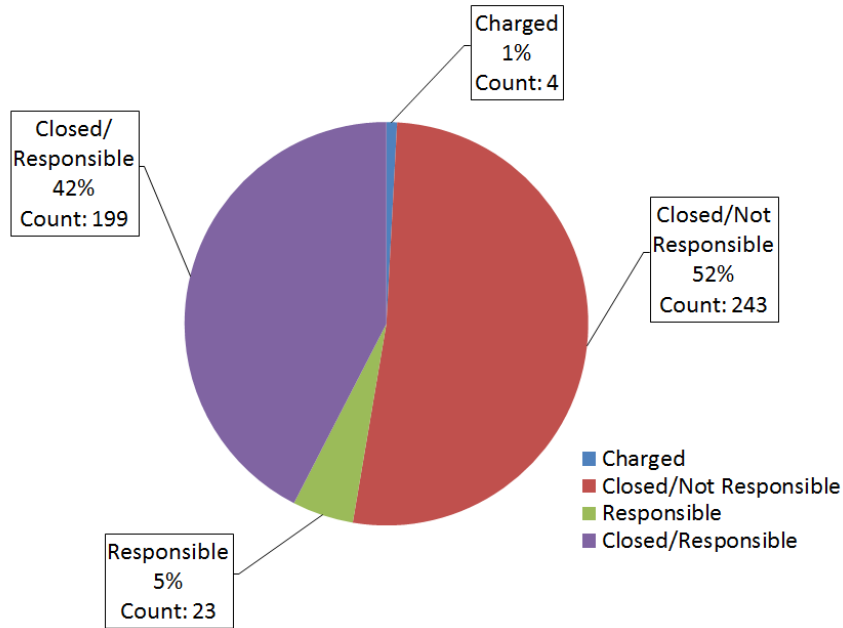

**Table 2: Status of 469 Individual Student Cases**



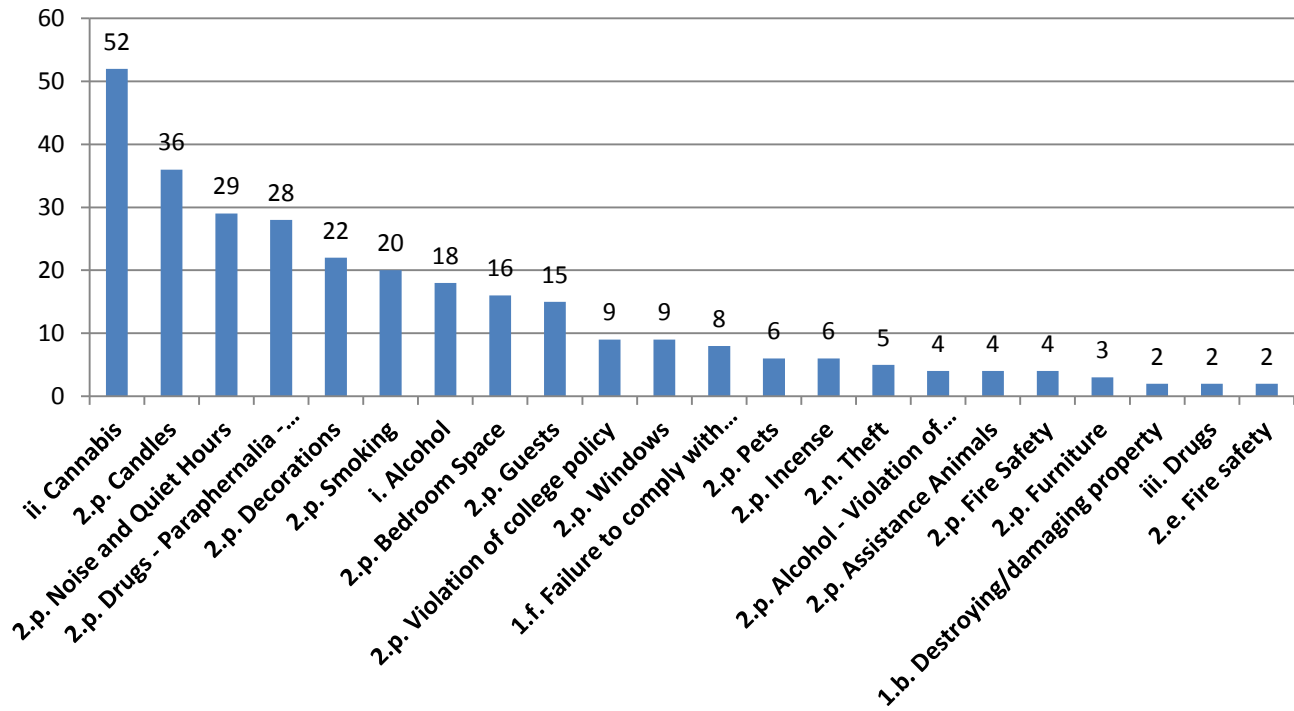

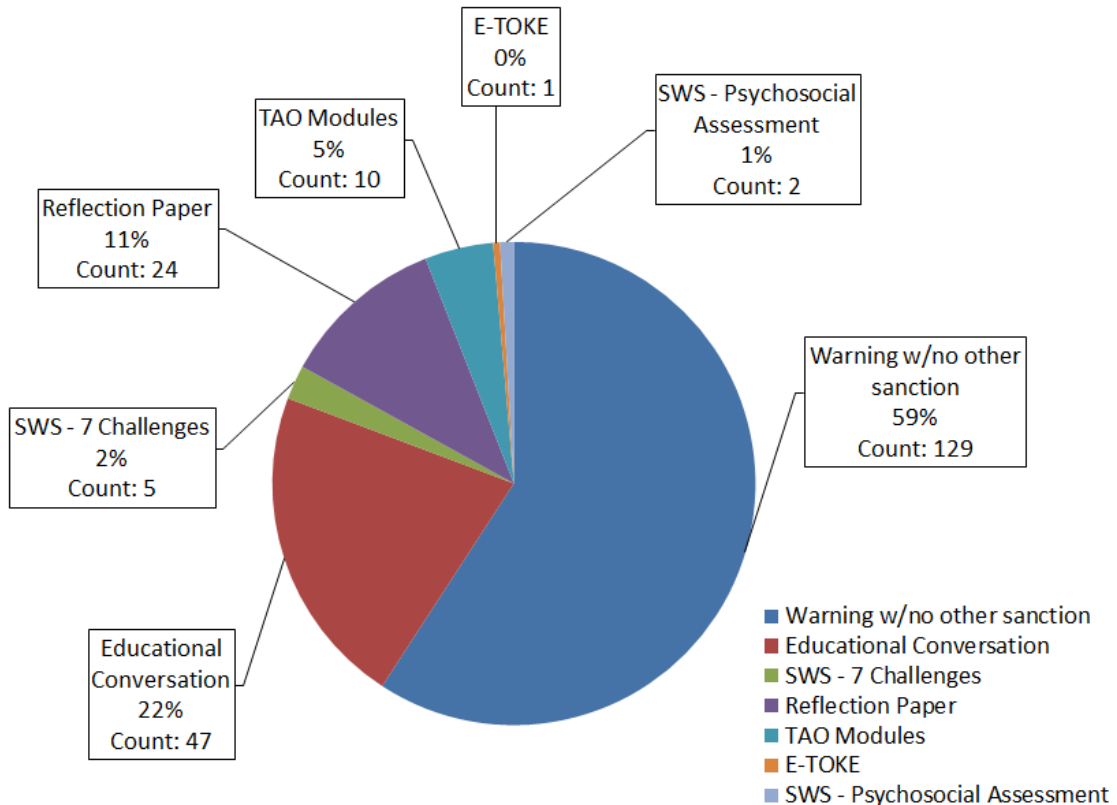

All 222 students found responsible were issued a sanction as follows:

- Warning – 210
- Probation – 7
- Suspension – 1

Table 2 Status of 469 Individual Student Cases

- **Charged** means the student is on notice that they have allegedly violated the Code and adjudication will occur
- **Closed/Not Responsible** means the student was found not responsible for violating the Code
- **Responsible** means the student has been found responsible for violating the Code and completion of sanction(s) is pending
- **Closed/Responsible** means the student has been found responsible for violating the Code and sanction(s) have been completed
