


**The Evergreen State College**

Almost all of the respondents planned to earn a Bachelor's Degree (98.7% of first-time, first-years; 99.7% of transfer students) and a little over one-third planned to earn a Master's Degree (36.9% of first-time, first-years; 36% of transfer students). Around ten percent of both groups (first-time, first-year 12.3%; transfer 9.7%) planned to earn a doctoral degree such as Ph.D., Ed.D., J.D., M.D., or D.D.S.

\*\* These numbers are adjusted after it was found that a relatively large number of students indicated that they planned to go on to earn a masters and/or doctoral-level education, but failed to mark a bachelor's agree. Many of these students also indicated that they planned to attend Evergreen until earning a Bachelor's degree on question 5 of the same survey. Therefore, students who indicated that they planned to earn a Master's degree or other doctoral level degree, were adjusted to indicate plans to earn a bachelor's degree. The discrepancy is probably due to the complex "mark all that apply" question format. The unadjusted percentage of first-time, first-years who indicated that they planned to earn a Bachelor's degree is 90.4% and 95.6% for transfer students.
