The chart below shows the areas that new students in the Tacoma Program indicated that they plan to study at Evergreen. Students' responses were coded into Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) 2000 codes. This CIP analysis a more detailed view of students' interest areas than the divisional analysis of students' responses. (For instance, in an analysis that grouped student comments into divisions the following CIP categories were grouped under the heading of "Science": Environmental Sciences, Biological and Biomedical Sciences, Physical Sciences, and Interdisciplinary Science, Computer Science, Engineering and Health Professions and Related Clinical Sciences.)

CAUTION: Numbers and percentages in this analysis are not mutually exclusive because many students wrote in more than one field of study; therefore, percentages cannot be added together. To see broader categories, refer to fields of study analyzed by divisions.
