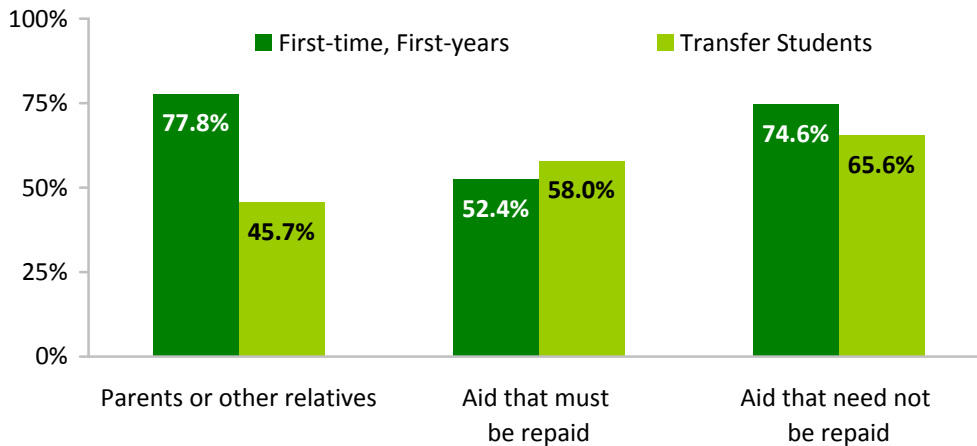

**Financial Support**

New students were asked about the financial support that they receive. A large majority of first-time, first-year students (77.8%) reported financial support from parents or other relatives in comparison to 45.7% of transfer students. Over half of new students reported receiving financial aid that must be repaid. First-time, first-year students more frequently reported relying on aid that need not be repaid (74.6%) than transfer students (65.5%).
