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**Summary: Attendance at Academic Statement Orientation sessions was higher in Fall 2013 than it was in the pilot year Fall 2012. Overall, 83% of new degree-seeking students at Olympia and Grays Harbor campuses attended at least one A.S. O-week session. Participation of first-time, first-year students climbed to 95% from 88% in the pilot year; participation of transfer students also rose to 78% compared to 74% in the pilot year.**

In terms of admission type, Returning Greeners and Washington Resident Transfer students were least likely to attend O-week sessions. First-time, first-years from out-of-state had the highest attendance rate.

Females were more likely to attend than males. New students who were low-income, veterans, American Indian, Asian, unreported race were less likely to attend. On average, students who opted not to attend had lower prior school GPAs. Students with conditional admission status were MORE likely to attend.
